



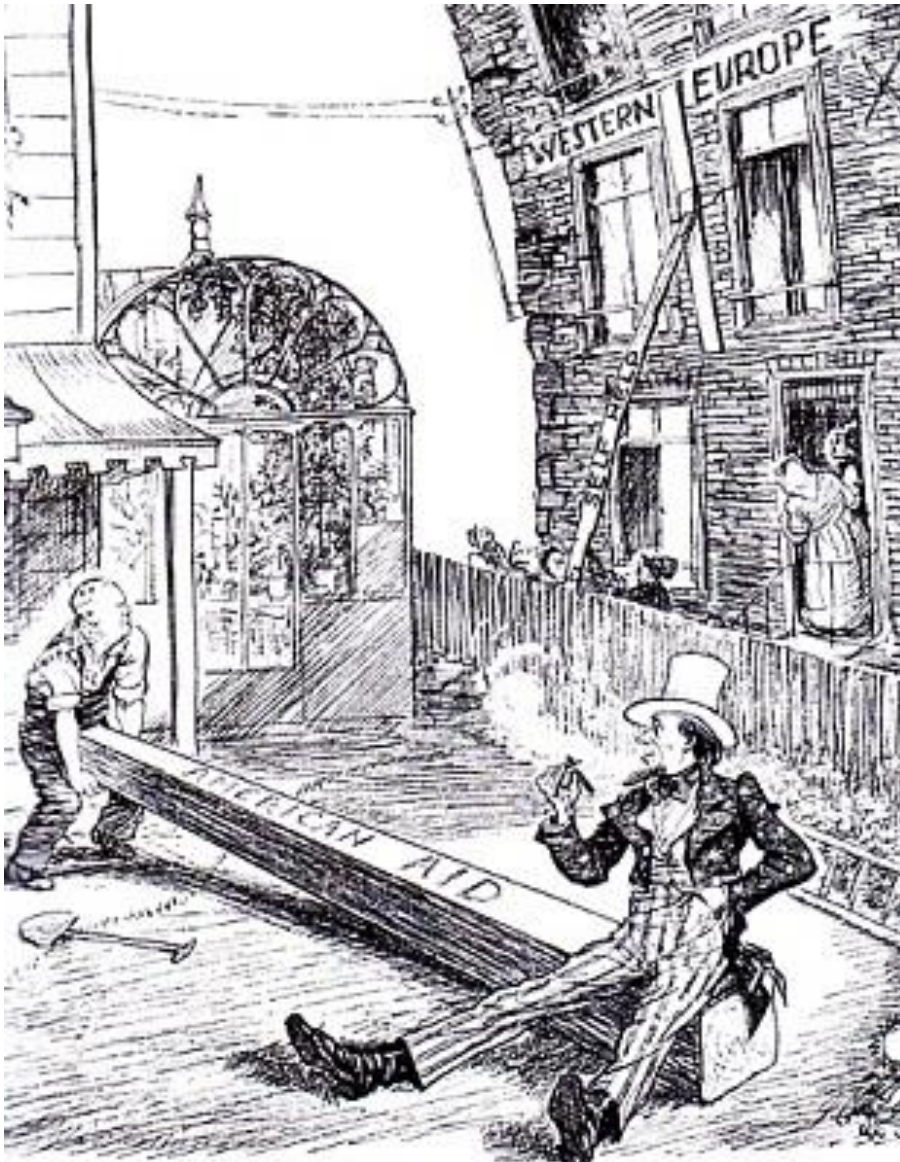

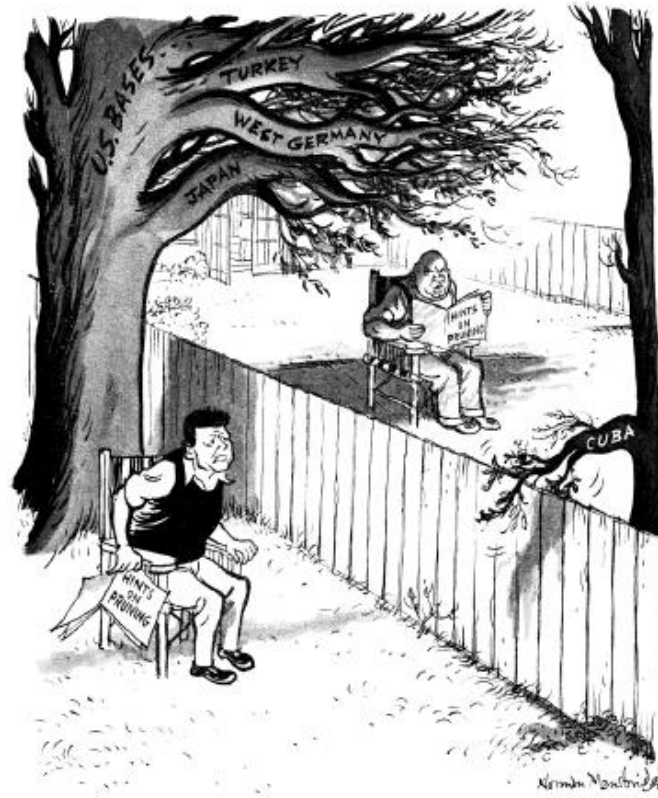

A cartoon published in Britain, 17th October 1962. President Kennedy is on the left. Khrushchev is on the right. Pruning means cutting back.

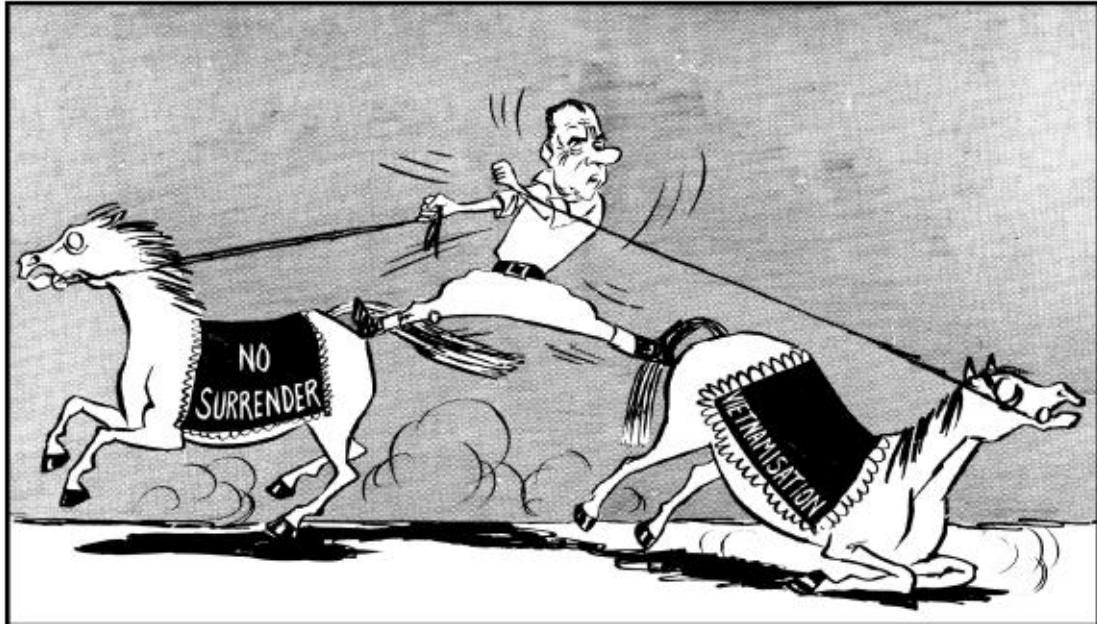

Dr. Kapp, an extreme nationalist, expressing his views about Germany's problems in 1919.

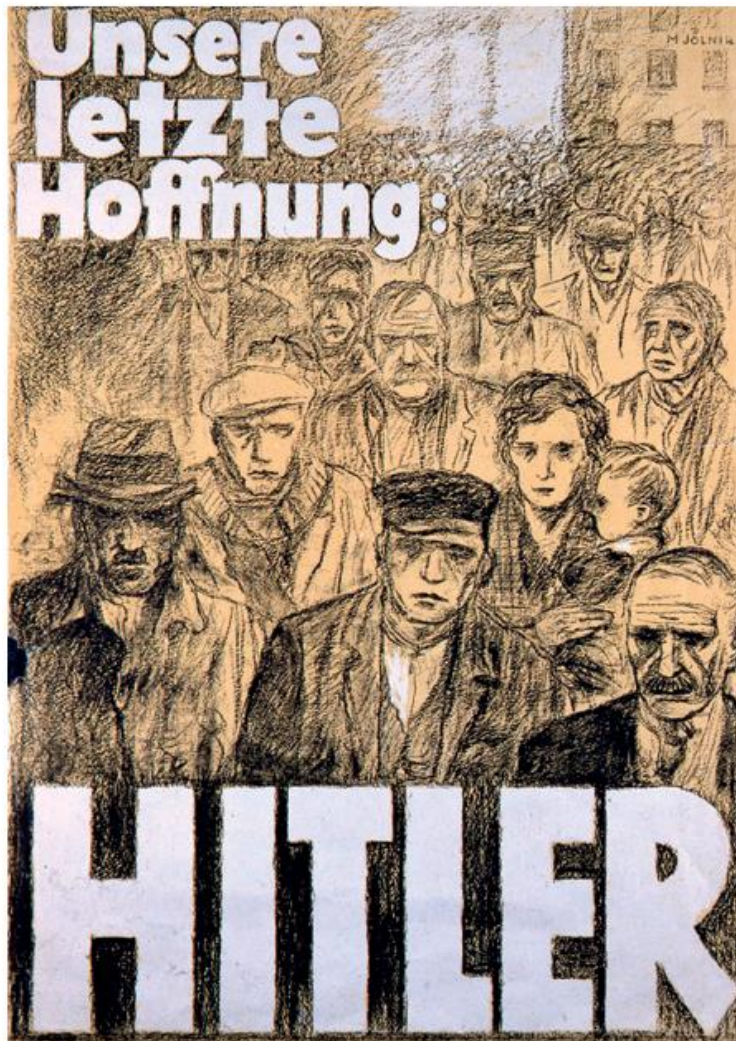
Why was this cartoon published in 1923? Use the source and your own knowledge to explain your answer.
